Download this application, fill it out, and submit it to the HOA office to receive response

"Noxious weeds identified on private property will be eradicated using herbicide treatments by a license/certified professional agent contracted and paid for by the Meadow Lake Homeowners Association. Notice of this change in policy was provided in writing to all property owners at Meadow Lake when it occurred in 2013. Property owners who object to this policy are given an opportunity to opt out by responding with this form. Property owners who reject this policy will be responsible for managing weeds on their property at their cost and are subject to fines for failure to do so."

For the past several years, the Meadow Lake Homeowners Association has worked to eliminate the spread of noxious weeds within Meadow Lake. This has been done by contracting several organizations to spray the weeds along the roads and in common use areas at Meadow Lake. This program has been very effective but weeds on private property were not being managed by many homeowners and are offsetting the efforts of the HOA Weed Management Program.

In 2013, in an effort to resolve this problem, noxious weeds identified on private property started being eradicated using herbicide treatments by a license/certified professional agent contracted and paid for by the Meadow Lake Homeowners Association.

If you do not wish to take advantage of the policy on your property at Meadow Lake, return the signed Opt-Out form to the HOA office. Below are some of the more common noxious weeds you will be responsible to remove.
